teams of two nursing students. Each team will make regular visits to some of our members next semester. They will do health assessments and then follow those folks throughout the semester. They will offer health education and friendly visiting twice a week from early February through April. We are excited about this opportunity to provide some extra support to a few of our members, while also helping to give the nursing students valuable hands-on experience in developing a variety of community nursing skills, including the health assessments and teaching about nutrition, safety and learning more about how to best interview and interact with an older population.
