

Securing Your Privacy

We are preparing to introduce more advanced security precautions for our website. We want to ensure the information in our database has the highest protection. We are working on this with our website's software designer Manuel Acevedo, who has a background in data security. He is requiring all villages using his software upgrade to a very high standard. The standard, called GDPR, is used in Europe and is more stringent than what our own government requires. We are really pleased that Manuel is leading this charge as security and confidentiality are our highest priorities.

On our end, we are updating our privacy policy and our handbook, appointing a Data Protection Officer (compliance officer) and we will create and execute confidentiality agreements for members of our Board, Volunteers and Committee members. As we develop this new protocol, we will keep you posted and when you sign on to our website, you will be required to agree to our privacy policy. We will report more on this issue when we get closer to having the changes in place. Stay tuned.
