

### A Note from Kate



# Things are Happening



### Survey News & Policy Changes

Responses to our two surveys - one of Volunteers and another of Members - along with follow-up meetings to discuss issues, provided the Board of Directors with valuable feedback. This information will help Coastal Neighbors do its best to meet the needs and interests of our Volunteers as well as our Members and to make our Village stronger and more vital. In a prime example, we revisited how memberships are defined in order to ensure that our Coastal Neighbors community is truly inclusive and to recognize the important role that our Volunteers play.

We did not change our full service memberships held by "Members." However, as each of your "Social Memberships" comes up for renewal, you will find we have changed the name "Social Membership" and replaced it

with a category we are calling "Sustaining Membership." This category will recognize any household that gives \$350 or more annually, and Sustaining Members will be welcome to participate in all Coastal Neighbors' social activities.

In addition, we wanted to make clear that Volunteers are welcome to participate in social activities; they do not need to become Sustaining Members in order to participate. To recap, the move toward inclusiveness recognizes the key role that our Volunteers play in our Village's community by providing rides and other services, and it recognizes how important Volunteers are for achieving Coastal Neighbors' mission: to help our members live in their own homes and stay connected to the community.

This is the amendment approved by the Board of Directors:

[Regarding Social Membership:] This membership category will be changed from "Social Membership" to "Sustaining Membership." A Sustaining Member is someone who gives \$350 or more annually to support Coastal Neighbors Network. The Sustaining gift offers donors the opportunity to participate in all Coastal Neighbors' social activities, along with our Single and Household Members, and our Volunteers. This gift is tax deductible as allowed by tax law.

Of course, we welcome donations and support from all, both financial and in kind. It takes a Village to make a Village!

While we got a 65% return rate from our Volunteer survey and valuable input that engendered positive change, we have not had as impressive a response rate to our Member survey. There is still time! Meditation



Our "Meditation and Aging Gracefully" group is embracing the rewards of meditation with Dr. Margaret Bacon, a clinical psychologist with 30 years of meditation experience. We learned to infuse calm and steadiness into a walking meditation as well as a sitting meditation, and some of us have actually been able to incorporate a regular practice into our lives. The daily discipline itself is empowering and the practice of meditation reveals - at least for me - the unharnessed agility of my mind to dash about and produce a steady stream of random thoughts. My job in meditation is to come back to focus on my breath, over and over and over. It is simple but not easy - and it is straightforward, not mysterious. I believe it is one of many "practices" that teach how to create open space in the crowded life of the mind, and then to develop insights and perspectives previously unknown.
